- Inform and educate members about legislative issues pertaining to forest land

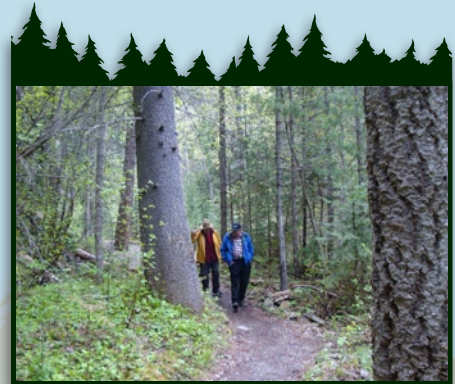


- Cooperate with forest industry, state and federal agencies and other organizations in all areas which further the Association's objectives
